Student Pastor's Cottage Opened

ANTIGONISH, June 25 – On Wednesday evening a number of friends from Antigonish motored to Cape George, there to take part in a happy event, the official opening of the new cottage which has been built as a residence for the student pastor of St. David's United Church. A brief service was conducted at the church by Mr. Frank Roebuck, student in charge, at which Rev. E. V. Forbes of Antigonish told the story of how the project had been carried through, extending thanks to all who had assisted and paying tribute to the memory of Mrs. Freda Ernst, whose name the cabin bears, and whose benefactions helped to make it possible. Greetings were read from the chairman of Pictou Presbytery, Rev. D. S. MacLeod, who regretted inability to be present. Rev. Dr. George A. Christie who had served the Cape charge in 1897 sent a gift of a picture for the cabin wall which was presented by Mr. A.L. MacIntosh. After adjournment all proceeded to the cottage which was inspected. Shower gifts were then presented to Mr. and Mrs. Roebuck, while ice cream and cake were enjoyed by all present.
