

Donald McDonald was the registered owner, but he probably owned a majority share of it, since in his will he wished to convey to Captain Angus McDonald "16 shares of schooner 'William B.' my property, provided he shall be willing to pay to my executors \$2,000 for such shares within 3 years of this date." Capt. Angus McDonald was apparently already "Master of said schooner." (will C-272)
