

Deed Arch Campbell &
John S. Campbell Reg.
10th Sept 1831
New Brunswick

This Indenture made the first day of August
on thousand eight hundred and twenty nine between
Archibald Campbell formerly of Cape George County
of Sydney and Province of Nova Scotia of the one part
and John Stephen Campbell sons to said Archibald Campbell County and Province
of the other part. Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum
of sixty pounds good and lawful money of the Province of Nova Scotia to every part
that can or will pay the said John Campbell and the said Stephen Campbell
with a lawful and just demand against their father Archibald Campbell the sum
of sixty pounds to be well and truly paid by the said John Campbell and Stephen
his Brother both joint bargain sell and convey unto the said John Campbell
and Stephen his Brother to their heirs Executors Administrators and assigns one hundred
and twenty six Acres that is to say John Campbell to have twenty six acres
and Stephen Campbell to have fifty acres well land lying and situated at Cape
George Bay and within as follows viz. Beginning at the N. E. corner
on the west by lands granted to Daniel Mc Cookin on the east by lands owned
and occupied by John Livingston the south by lands granted to Mrs Newnham
with all the rights titles Hereditaments houses out houses ways waters water courses
woods under woods and angular the property described to have and to hold unto the
said John Campbell & Stephen his Brother and to their proper heirs assigns
behof forever as well in law as Equity and he said John & Stephen doth warrant
and defend the same to be free from all Homage or Vexation of any kind
or persons whatsoever unto the said John Campbell and his Brother Stephen
Campbell and to their heirs and assigns forever in whole or in part I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal the day and year first above written

Catherine Mc Donald his wife

This Indenture made at Antigonish in the
District of the County of Sydney and Province of Nova
Scotia this nineteenth day of April in the year four
thousand one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine between
Hugh Mc Donald of Antigonish he deceased in the
District of the County of Sydney and Province of Nova Scotia
the one part and John Cameron of the other part Witnesseth that the said Hugh
Mc Donald and Catherine Mc Donald his wife for and in consideration of the sum

sum of One hundred and thirty pounds of lawful money of the Province of Nova Scotia
expressed to them in hand by the said John Cameron well and truly paid at
before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby
acknowledged Have granted bargained and assigned with full release and confirmed and by these presents
Do grant bargain sell assign with full release and confirmed unto the said John Cameron his
heirs and assigns that full parcel plot of land situated lying and being in the upper settlement
of the South River of Antigonish expressed in the upper District of the County of Sydney and
being situated and bounded as follows viz. Beginning at a stake on the eastern side of the South
River of Antigonish expressed and running thence South fifty two degrees east one hundred
and sixty chains or until it comes to the rear lane thence South thirty eight degrees east
seven chain chains thirty seven links thence North fifty two degrees west one hundred
and eighty three chains twenty five links or until it comes to the South River of Antigonish
expressed thence North Eastwardly down the stream to the place of beginning which
said parcel or parcel of land contains in the whole Five Hundred Acres more
or less being bounded on the north by lands of John Mc Donald expressed in the South River
of lands granted to John Mc Donald on the South west by land in the possession of John Mc Donald
and on the north west by the said South River of Antigonish together with all and singular
the houses out houses barns stables buildings ways roads waters water courses easements conveniences
hereditaments and appurtenances thereof thence North Eastwardly along with the stream and numerous
acres more or less and all the estate right title interest
claim properly and lawfully which they shared Hugh Mc Donald and Catherine Mc Donald his wife
or assigns may have in and upon the same by right of Sale or otherwise I have and I hold
full sole good and lawful power with the appurtenances unto the said John Cameron his heirs and
assigns to his and their own proper use benefit and behoof forever And the said Hugh Mc Donald
doth hereby his full execution and administration doth covenant promise and agree to hand unto
the said John Cameron his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns in manner and form
following that is to say that the said Hugh Mc Donald is and now stands seized of a good service
receptacle of inheritance in fee simple of and to the lands and premises herein before granted
without any condition limitation or power of reversion whatsoever and that the said Hugh Mc Donald
doth hold good right full power and lawful and absolute authority to grant bargain sell
and convey the same with the appurtenances to the said John Cameron his heirs and assigns
so they are herein before granted bargained sold and conveyed or intended or intended so be
And also that he the said John Cameron his heirs and assigns may from time to time and at
all times lawfully lawfully peaceably and quietly enter into have hold occupy possess and enjoy
the above granted premises with the appurtenances without the lawful interruption
hindrance molestation interruption or denial from the said Hugh Mc Donald his heirs
Executors Administrators or assigns any person or persons claiming or to claim by force or
claim from them or either of them And further that he the said Hugh Mc Donald his
heirs Executors and Administrators doth above granted premises and every part and parcel
thereof with the appurtenances to the said John Cameron his heirs and assigns against
all lawful claims and demands of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall
